She was a good person. She left three small children who will forever remember and be scarred by this pain.a?•

Donna tried a few lines like â??We live in a broken worldâ?• or â??Our freedom of choice sometimes brings us great painâ?• but neither of these was satisfying.

Truth be told, we may never know why righteous people get what the wicked deserve (vs. 14), or grasp fully the meaning of life and death (v. 17b). After decades of reflection, I have discovered one thought that brings comfort in such times: I do not know why this has happened, but I am convinced that the righteous are in the hands of a God who loves us beyond comprehension.
