Paul contrasts the two sons of Abraham: Ishmael, the son of Hagar, Sarahâ??s servant, and Isaac, born to Sarah â??as the result of a divine promise.â?• Paul calls Ishmael the â??son born according to the flesh,â?• while Isaac is the â??son born by the power of the Spiritâ?• (Galatians 4:29).

We, like Isaac, are declared to be children of promise. We become Godâ??s children as the result of Godâ??s divine intervention and fatherhood (John 1:12-13). Nothing we do on our own can make us any better or more deserving of being Godâ??s children. It is only through His ability that we can become a member of the family and the promise, because nothing is â??too hardâ?• for God.
